Do I need a referral to see a specialist?⁴

If your primary care physician determines that you require covered services from other providers, you will be referred to an in-network specialist. You don't need a referral for obstetrics-gynecology, optometry, dental, or some behavioral health services.

Can I get care while I'm traveling?

What if I get sick and need to see an oncologist, cardiologist, or other specialist? Kaiser Permanente has hundreds of highly trained specialists, including award-winning oncologists, nephrologists, and cardiologists; we have expert doctors in more than 50 medical and surgical specialties. We want our members to get the highest quality care, no matter where that takes them. Most of the time that care can be found at Kaiser Permanente. However, if we're unable to provide the care or treatment you need, our doctors can refer you to one of our affiliated specialists.

Can I see doctors that are not in the Kaiser Permanente network?

We want our members to get the right care, no matter where they get it. Most of the time that care can be found right at Kaiser Permanente. But, for some rare conditions, our doctors may refer members to an affiliated provider in our area.
